

Transport

If you are travelling by car: Leave the M5 at junction 11 and take the A40 towards Cheltenham. At the next roundabout take the second exit; Thistle Cheltenham is immediately on the left. We have 220 parking spaces available on-site for a small additional charge for all overnight guests. To programme your sat-nav, please use the postcode GL51 0TS

If you are travelling by train: Cheltenham railway station is 1.5 miles from the hotel.



Accommodation

Jury's Inn Cheltenham Hotel

Located in the Cotswolds, close to the historic town of Cheltenham, and set within its own landscaped gardens the four-star Thistle Cheltenham offers a restaurant, bar, indoor pool and health club. Bedrooms are en-suite with bath/shower, TV, telephone, wifi, safe, hairdryer and tea/coffee making facilities. Complimentary car parking is available on-site at the hotel.

Places Visited

Gordon Russell Museum

Located in the original workshop, the Museum celebrates the life and work of Gordon Russell and his Company over a period of sixty years in Broadway, Worcestershire. Its unique collection of furniture embraces a range of styles spanning this rich period of design: from the Arts and Crafts to 30s streamline Modernism; Utility Furniture to 1980s luxury post modernism. To complement this collection the Museum has an extensive archive of original drawings, notebooks, catalogues and correspondence, as well as access to the firm's original reference library.

Stanway House & Fountain

Stanway is an outstandingly beautiful example of a Jacobean manor house, owned by Tewkesbury Abbey for 800 years then for 500 years by the Tracy family and their descendants, the Earls of Wemyss who still live there. The house, its fascinating furniture, the jewel-like Gatehouse, the church and 14th-century Tithe Barn, the 18th-century water-garden, the specimen trees and avenues, the surrounding villages, farms, parkland and woodland all subtly combine to create an enclave of very English and almost magical harmony. Thanks to its location, at the foot of the Cotswold escarpment, Stanway has been protected from many changes of the 20th century. Recently it has seen the gradual restoration of the 18th century watergarden, probably designed by the greatest of British landscape gardeners, Charles Bridgeman. The formal Canal, on a terrace above the house, the striking Pyramid and eight ponds have been reinstated, and a single-jet fountain, at 300 feet the highest fountain in Britain and the highest gravity fountain in the world, has been added.

Court Barn Museum

Court Barn Museum celebrates the talented designers and craftspeople who have worked in Chipping Campden and the north Cotswolds since the beginning of the twentieth century. This is a story of the Arts and Crafts movement and its legacy, a story of how a small town in a beautiful setting became a gathering place for designers and craftspeople of national and international reputation. The permanent displays focus on nine individuals or workshops including C.R. Ashbee, Katharine Adams, F.L. Griggs, Gordon Russell, Hart Silversmiths and Robert Welch.

Hidcote Manor

The Hidcote Manor Garden is situated in the beautiful Cotswold countryside amongst hills, rolling valleys, and drystone walls.

Hidcote comprises of a series of small gardens within a garden, but also with long avenues bordered by different plantings. The garden is famous for rare shrubs and trees as well as its outstanding design features. There are water features, wild flower areas and pools with plenty of places to sit and take in the atmosphere. See the long herbaceous borders which gives a great splash of colour from July and walk amongst the old scented roses along the walkway and small garden houses.
