


The tour commences and concludes at the Hilton Puckrup Hall Hotel, Tewkesbury.

Transport

If you are travelling by car:

From the M5: Exit the M5 at J8, then join M50. Exit at J 1, signposted Malvern. At roundabout take a left and you will see the Hilton Puckrup Hall on your right. Drive down the driveway and you will see the entrance to the hotel and Golf reception.

If you are travelling by train: The nearest train station is Ashchurch for Tewkesbury – 8 miles away

Check-in and departure from the hotel

Bourton House

Bourton House Garden features luxuriant terraces and wide herbaceous borders with stunning plant, texture and colour combinations. Imaginative topiary includes a knot garden, parterre and topiary walk and there are several spring-fed water features including a raised basket pond from the Great Exhibition of 1851. You will also find a unique Shade House, a serene White Garden and many creatively planted pots. A raised 18th century walk provides an enticing link to the Cotswold landscape beyond.

Sezincote

Sezincote is unique. At the heart of a traditional, family-run estate covering 3,500 acres of rolling Cotswold countryside stands a 200-year-old Mogul Indian palace, set in a romantic landscape of temples, grottoes, waterfalls and canals reminiscent of the Taj Mahal. Neglected during the Second World War, the garden was restored in 1968 by Sir Cyril and Lady Kleinwort who were advised by Graham Stuart Thomas. Their work includes the canals and Irish yews in the South Garden, evocative of Moghul paradise gardens, a curving conservatory, home to many tender climbing plants, and little pavilion also in Indian style, and all the exceptionally fine planting of the water garden, where many rare plants can be seen. Streams and pools are lined with great clumps of bog-loving plants and the stream is crossed by an Indian bridge adorned with Brahmin bulls. Ornaments include a temple to Surya the sun god, and a snake coiled around a column in the Snake Pond.

As an important haven for a rich variety of flora and fauna, the gardens have been developed to not only please the eye, but sit in succinct harmony with nature. From the classic order of the Cottage Garden to the pastoral beauty of the Wildflower Meadow, discover these unique spaces, along with hidden curios and horticultural innovations, on a tour that offers a personal perspective of this much-admired public figure. Following your garden tour, you will return to the beautiful setting of the Orchard Room and enjoy a three-course dinner with wine and a Q&A session with Alan Titchmarsh, beloved Gardeners World TV presenter for many years.

Miserden Estate

Miserden is a family-run, rural estate overlooking the Golden Valley in an area of outstanding natural beauty in the Cotswolds. The estate encompasses 850 acres of woodland, farmland and gardens providing a sanctuary for wildlife and a tranquil escape to allow you to spend time with your family and friends. At Miserden we take pride in our collaborative relationship with the local community, many of whom are directly involved in everyday life on the estate. The Garden, Farming and Forestry have historically provided the backbone of the estate but more recently the introduction of The Nursery with a beautifully ornate café set inside an old Edwardian greenhouse have been a welcome addition. https://www.miserden.org/

Painswick Rococo Garden

Designed in the 1740s as a fanciful pleasure garden for the owner of Painswick House and his guests, today it's a place to take in the spectacular views of the Cotswold countryside and it's magical follies. As the UK's only complete surviving rococo garden, there's nowhere like Painswick Rococo Garden. September sees a crescendo of colour in the Exedra Garden, where perennials and annuals provide a magical display, including African marigolds, mirabilis jalapa, and salvia horminum Oxford Blue. Behind the maze, our collection of Japanese maples are beginning to turn magnificent shades of red and gold. Elsewhere, the extensive crop of heritage fruits in the walled garden swells and ripens as harvest approaches. Apples and pears grown in the garden are used by our café.

Rockcliffe Gardens

Rockcliffe Garden is an 8 acre garden created over the last 30 years in the heart of the Cotswolds. Featuring rose terraces, herbaceous borders, a rectangular pond with Cornus Contraversa Variegate stretching its branches across it and a large lawn leading up to a ha-ha edged with pyramids of Beech. You will also find Yew edged room, canals and a walked kitchen garden and greenhouses. Above the kitchen garden there is a path flanked by Yew leading up through the orchard to a stone dovecote which was built in 2001. Upton Wold

The Hidden Garden of the Cotswolds. Set in a beautiful Cotswold landscape, this hidden private garden has been created over forty years, originally with the help of landscape architects Hal Moggridge and the late Brenda Colvin. Upton Wold Garden has an exceptional collection of trees, shrubs and plants, and also holds a National Collection of Juglans (Walnut) with nearly 70 specimens and of Pterocarya. https://www.uptonwold.co.uk/index.php




