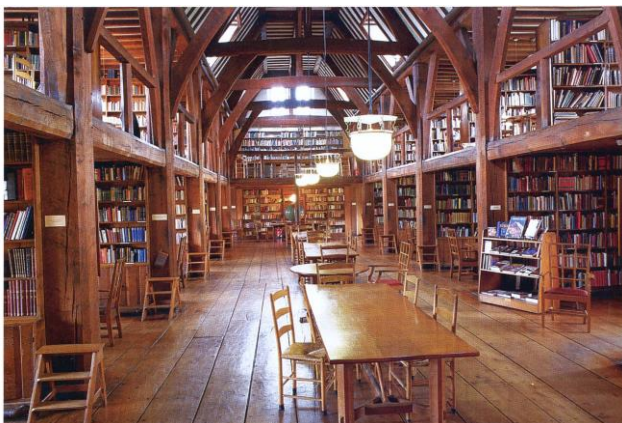

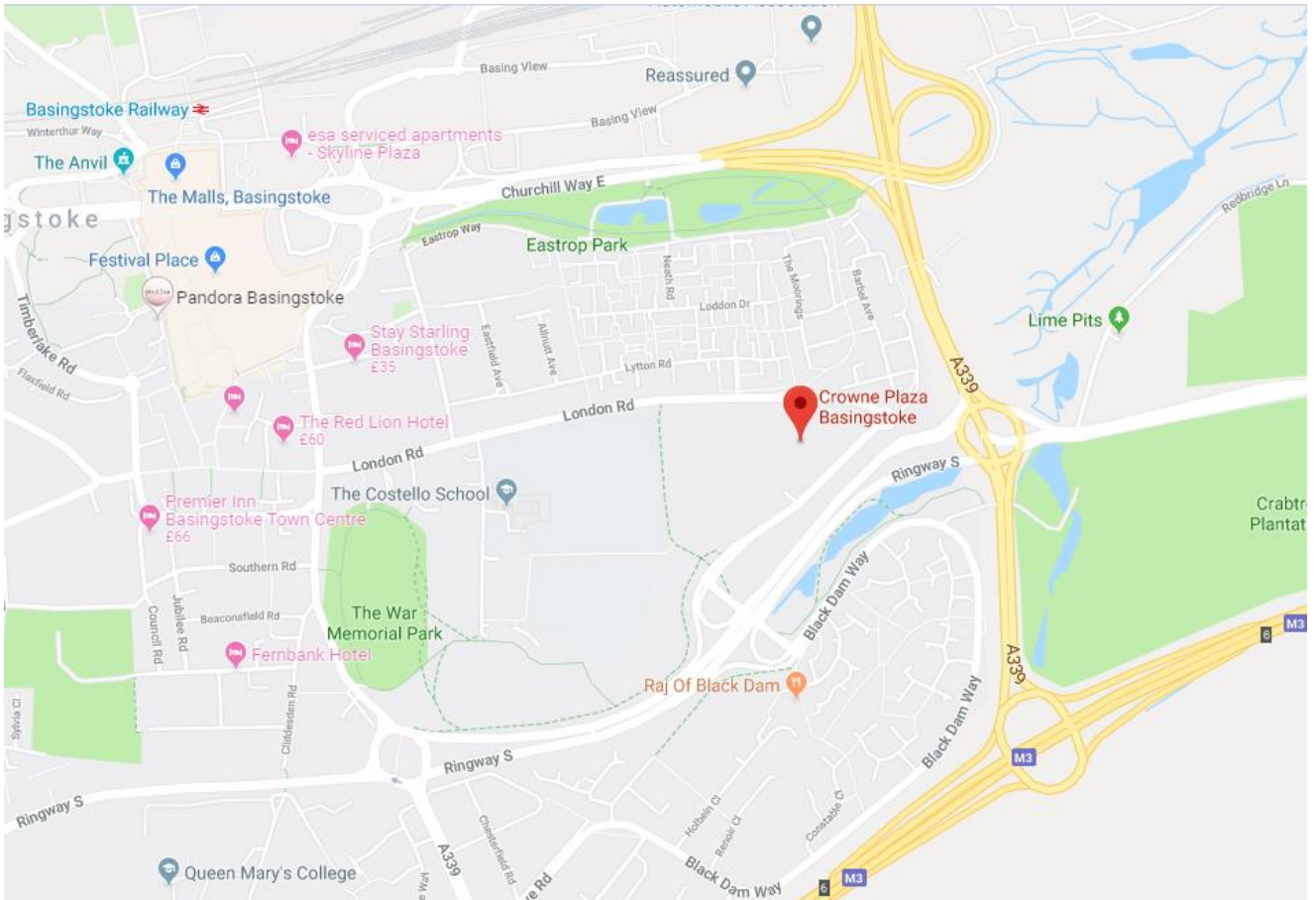

Transport



If you are travelling by car:

From London, follow the M3 towards Southampton. Exit at junction 6, towards Basingstoke/Alton A339. At the roundabout, take 2nd exit onto A339 and follow signs for A30. At the Black Dam roundabout, take the 1st exit on Ringway S/A30 and then the exit to Black Dam/Eastrop, turn left and then turn right at Old Common Road and your destination will be on the left.

If you are travelling by train: The nearest railway station is Basingstoke which is approx. 1.5 miles from the hotel.



Accommodation

Check-in and departure from the hotel

Places Visited

Vann Garden

The garden surrounds and complements a historic family home dating from the 16 century, giving a series of garden rooms of great variety, from the formal old “cottage garden” at the front with delightfully informal planting, to a robust pergola of Bargate stone by W.D.Caröe. A stream enters the garden from the north and first runs in a rhyll, enclosed by large Yew hedges (1909). Originally planted as a rose garden the depredations of the wild deer have led us to remove the roses and re-plant with foliage plants to give round-the- year interest. The unique Water Garden by Gertrude Jekyll (1911) comprises a succession of small ponds crossed by Bargate stone paths and bridges It flows down to a wild White Garden and coppiced woodland.

St Christophers Church

St. Christopher’s Church was built as a result of the westward expansion of the small town of Haslemere following the coming of the railway and the addition of a part of a nearby parish. The initial proponent of the project, in the last decade of the 19th century, was the Parish Rector, Rev’d Sanders Etheridge, and his work was continued enthusiastically by his successor, Rev’d George Aitken, a noted social reformer and Liberal. Likely under his influence and that of Algernon Methuen, the publisher and a parishioner, the architect Charles Spooner – the follower of William Morris and a light of the flourishing Arts & Crafts movement of the time – was engaged to design the new church. St Christopher’s was built to a very high standard over quite a short time and was consecrated by the Bishop of Winchester in September 1903.

Bedaes was founded by John Haden Badley in 1893 to be a humane alternative to the authoritarian regimes typical of late-Victorian public schools. The Memorial Library and adjoining Lupton Hall (the original assembly hall) are Grade-1 listed arts and crafts buildings.

Manor House Gardens

Just over 32 years ago this historic garden at Upton Grey, was nothing more than an unkempt jungle. What we didn’t realise when we bought the property was that underneath the jungle were the foundations of a very special garden, indeed one that Gertrude Jekyll had designed in 1908 for a house belonging to Charles Holme, a leading figure in the Arts and Crafts movement. The work on this garden’s restoration has been an exciting and rewarding adventure of discovery.
