




# Magnificent Men in Their Flying Machines





The tour starts and finishes at Marriott Huntingdon Hotel.

#### **Transport**

#### Travelling by car:

Form Birmingham Airport: Leave the airport and head towards the A45 signposted Birmingham, after 521 take the 1st exit on to the A446, after 1.4 miles at M6 Junction 3a take the 4th exit off the roundabout on to the M6 direction London. Leave the M6 at junction 19 signposted M1, A14 continue straight forward onto the A14 direction Corby, Kettering. Continue forward on the A14 for 40 miles and take junction 23, at the roundabout take the 4th exit and the hotel will be on your left, take the slip road into the business park, take the 1st exit and take the first left into the hotel.

From Heathrow Airport: Leave the Airport and head towards the M4 signposted Gatwick Airport and the West, take the M4 and leave the M4 at junction 4B and take the M25 sign posted Watford, leave the M25 at junction 21A, at the next roundabout take the 1st exit on to the A405, carry along the A405 after 2 miles take the A414, continue over 2 roundabouts and take the A1 North bound. Leave the A1 at junction 10,

take the 4th exit at the up and comming roundabout, take the A14 sign posted Cambridge. At the next roundabout take the 4th exit - the hotel will be on your left, take the slip road into Hinchingbrooke Business Park, take the first exit off the roundabout and the hotel will be your first turning on your left.

#### Road works taking place:

There are major roadworks in the immediate vicinity of the hotel (which sits adjacent to a very busy junction on the A14). These mean that delays and congestion are inevitable on arrival on a Friday afternoon (particularly if travelling from the A1) and that sufficient time (at least an extra 30 mins) be allowed for this. *These roadworks are scheduled to last until 2020.* 

Travelling by rail: The nearest station is Huntingdon, which is 3.2 km from the Hotel.



#### **Marriott Huntingdon Hotel**

Located on the outskirts of Cambridgeshire, the four-star Huntingdon Marriott Hotel offers a restaurant, bar, fitness centre, indoor swimming pool and comfortable bedrooms with private bath/shower, TV, telephone, air-conditioning, safe, and tea/coffee making facilities. #### Check-in and departure from the hotel

#### Dining

### **(i)** Places Visited

#### Imperial War Museum, Duxford

Today IWM Duxford is established as the European centre of aviation history. The historic site, outstanding collections of exhibits and regular world-renowned Air Shows combine to create a unique museum where history really is in the air.

Throughout the day small groups will be taken for the exclusive flight on the De Havilland Dragon Rapide which will take you up and over the aerodrome for approximately 20 minutes.

#### **The Shuttleworth Collection**

The Shuttleworth Collection is designed to create the atmosphere of the 1920s aerodrome and spans from the early pioneering aircraft up to World War II aircraft. Highlights include the Bleriot type XI which is identical to the one which first crossed the English Channel in 1909, and the Bristol Boxkite which was built for the film "Those Magnificent Men in their Flying Machines".
