Transport

The Hilton City Hotel is excellently situated in the centre of Leeds adjacent to the main station.

Travelling by car: The hotel can be easily reached via the M1, M621 and M62. There are 80 parking spaces available at the hotel, payment for which can be made locally for £15 per day.

From the M1, M62 and M621 exit at junction 3. Follow signs for the city centre for approximately 1 mile. Then follow signs for inner ring road and airport and the hotel is on the left hand side.

Travelling by train: The closest railway station is Leeds which is 0.3 miles away - approximately 6 minutes' walk or a short taxi ride from the hotel.



Hilton Leeds City

The four-star Hilton Leeds City Hotel is located in the vibrant heart of the city. The hotel is modern and contemporary, following an extensive refurbishment at the end of 2012. The hotel has a fitness room, sauna, steam room and indoor heated swimming pool. Guest rooms are bright and airy and all have TV, hairdryer and telephone.

Check-in and departure from the hotel

On the day of arrival you will be able to check-in at the hotel from 15.00, and the tour manager will meet you in the evening at the welcome reception.

On the last day of the tour, the tour will not finish until approximately 17.45 - 18.30 so you should check with your tour manager, or the hotel reception, where luggage should be stored until your departure.

If you have booked to stay an extra night at the hotel, this is on a bed and breakfast basis and check out from the hotel is at 12:00.

Dining

On the first night of your stay, a private three-course dinner with wine is provided. During the second evening of the tour, dinner is provided at the hotel restaurant. Breakfast on both days of your stay is included in the price but meals other than these stated are not included.



Salts Mill

In 1853, Salts Mill was opened by Sir Titus Salt as a huge textile factory. During the peak of its production, the mill manufactured 30,000 yards of cloth every single day and was an integral aspect of both the British and global textile industry. Now the space has been transformed into a hub for art and leisure, and contains one of the largest collections of work by the Bradford born artist, David Hockney. This permanent collection displays paintings, prints and photographs dating from 1960's to the present day. Salts Mill is located in the village of Saltaire which is a UNESCO World Heritage Site and a centre of architectural and historical importance. http://www.saltsmill.org.uk/

Cartwright Hall

Cartwright Hall is the civic art gallery in Bradford. It was built on the former site of Manningham Hall using a gift of £40,000 donated by Samuel Lister and it is named after Edmund Cartwright. The gallery which opened in 1904 initially had a display of artworks loaned from other galleries and private collections until it was able to purchase a permanent collection of Victorian and Edwardian works using money raised by the 1904 Bradford Exhibition.

Hepworth Wakefield

The Hepworth Wakefield gallery opened in 2011 and has been described by the Independent as "one of the finest contemporary art museums in Europe". The gallery places emphasis on work from Wakefield's own art collection by artists such as Henry Moore, Ben Nicholson, Graham Sunderland, Paul Nash and LS Lowry. This is combined with exhibitions by modern artists, and rarely seen works by Barbara Hepworth. Designed by British architect David Chipperfield, the gallery is a striking example of innovative contemporary architecture and can be regarded as a work of art in itself. http://www.hepworthwakefield.org/





Gerald has lectured to societies on more than a hundred different cultural topics ranging from the Renaissance to Twentieth Century British Art. '20th Century Art in Yorkshire' - An introduction to the life and works of David Hockney, and a summary of the tour to follow.

'Barbara Hepworth and Henry Moore' - A lecture about the lives and influence of artists Barbara Hepworth and Henry Moore.


